## **Training Officers**

High Rise training starts 4/12 and will run for 2 months.

Company Officer Development class is starting up again.

Dept of Forestry is offering S215 which is mandated for Strike Team participation for engine company officers.

#### **EMS Advisory Council**

**County EMS** – All EMS contracts are signed with ALS providers. Saved 6% from last year. Front line services remain unchanged. 10 ambulances are vans primarily for non emergency use. Compliance for Paramedics Plus moved from 92% to 90%. OMD/CME contracts remain in force. 1 year contract with FD anticipated. Increase in fees, decrease in reserves and increase in millage are expected to maintain status quo. Phillips EKG/Defib 60 units to be deployed from May to June 2010. 12 lead transmitting with cellular modems seems to be effective. EPCR has been unfunded for Fds. EMS study underway.

**Med Dir** MCB met twice and there are 2 new Drs on the MCB. MCB has approved the Phillips MRX. Trauma Centers 1 in Manatee and 1 in Pasco are looking to open. This could affect BFMC if the number of patients coming to BFMC drops below required minimum. H1N1 is decreasing in incidence. 92% of patients transferred to ER beds in 20 minutes from stretchers. St Petersburg Grand Prix is coming next week. Annual report out in April.

SS Open north hub, new laptops ordered for EPCRs old ones going to be used for navigation.

911 now moving into priority dispatch.
